

# 2019-2020 Independence 4-H Project Guide

Here is a roundup of projects to help plan your 4-H year. Please take some time to review the wide variety of projects with your 4-H'er before the September 4<sup>th</sup> registration meeting. Also note that dates are listed to help families avoid conflicts between 4-H and other school and family commitments. Please be sure to add the dates to your calendar once your 4-H'er is confirmed in the project. 4-H members must attend six hours of project meetings in order to receive record book credit and a project pin.

We are introducing a new sign-up system in hopes it will allow more 4-H'ers to participate in their preferred projects. You will be receiving registration tickets prior to September 4<sup>th</sup>. Fill out the tickets by preference (use #1 for the project your 4-H'er is most eager to participate in, #2 for their second favorite, etc.). You'll turn in the tickets when you meet the project leaders at the meeting. We cannot guarantee everyone will get all their choices but will be making a concerted effort to do so. If you are interested in doing more than 6 projects, let the project leaders of those additional projects know and they will add you to their roster if space allows.

Each listing also includes if the project has a material fee and what the age group for the project is. 4-H age groups are based on the age of the child by December 31<sup>st</sup> of the program year: Primary (5 to 8), Junior (9 to 10), Intermediate (11 to 13) Senior (14 to 19).

Please note: Sometimes meetings (especially for outdoor projects) will need to be rescheduled, and the project leader will notify you asap with a new meeting date. Thank you for understanding. Have fun planning your year and we'll see you September 4th!

This is a county market project that spans two 4-H years. Project members must have poultry brooding experience and be prepared to manage and handle large birds. The focus of this project is to promote heritage turkeys, especially those listed in the American Standard of Perfection and on the conservation list of The Livestock Conservancy. In early spring, project members purchase young turkey poults to raise for the Thanksgiving market and/or for exhibition and breeding. We do not have scheduled meetings but meet individually with project members a few times early in the growing season. Our main concentration of group activity is in the weeks just prior to Thanksgiving, getting the birds ready for processing and sale. The turkeys are reserved on-line by customers and picked up in Sebastopol just prior to Thanksgiving. This project is co-sponsored by Slow Food Russian River who help promote these organically fed Heritage Turkeys for the Thanksgiving market. Please note that this project starts in early spring 2020 to raise turkeys for Thanksgiving 2020.
